Registration Information

1. Registration for term 2 is October 21st and 22nd. Room - Parker 210, 9:00 a.m.-12:00 noon. Registration is on a first come first serve basis. Any registrations received after October 22nd will be late. A \$25.00 late fee charge will be added to tuition and fees.
2. Registration forms must be signed by your advisor, if they are not signed, you will not be able to register.
3. Registration forms must be filled out completely, if you need help, stop in to see Beth BEFORE registration.
4. If you cannot register on those days, please let Beth know BEFORE registration so you do not have to pay a late fee.
5. If you are a continuing student taking 3 courses, your fees will be:

6. Florida Tuition Voucher pays this term. If you have not applied, see Leigh in the Financial Aid office. This voucher will give you \$367.50 towards tuition.

Running for an Office ?

Remember, if you are running for a Student Government Association office, you need to declare your candidacy. The deadline for declarations is TODAY, October 5. If you have not done so already, you will need to put your name, phone number, and the office for which you hope to run on a piece of paper, (typed). Hand this letter (in a sealed envelope) into the day division office.

The Administration will review your declaration based on the following qualifications: you must 1) have a minimum of a 2.00 grade point average at the time of election, 2) not be on probation, 3) not be an officer of any college club during your time in office, and 4) be a full time student.

You will be notified by October 7 of your eligibility to run for office. If you are rejected, you are eligible to an immediate appeal based upon grievance procedures. Any candidate will be disqualified who makes false statements about qualifications for office.

On October 8th at 2:00, in the student lounge, there will be a meeting of all qualified candidates. The purpose of this meeting is to discuss campaigning procedures in detail. This meeting will also be for answering any questions you may have in regard to running for an office. Your active campaigning time will be from October 11 through October 20. The elections will be held on October 21 and 22.
