


The Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology degree program is based on the scientist-practitioner model. Specifically, its goals are to train future psychologists in the core knowledge areas of the discipline; to prepare them to advance this knowledge by evaluating, developing, and scientifically examining important applied aspects of professional practice; and to acquire necessary skills in evidence-based assessment and intervention techniques. 119 credits

Doctor of Psychology (Psy.D. program)

The Psy.D. in Clinical Psychology degree program is based on the practitioner-informed-by-science model. Specifically, its goals are to train future psychologists in the core knowledge areas of the discipline and to prepare them to provide evidence-based assessment, intervention, and consultation services across a full range of populations, settings, and formats. 118 credits

The doctoral programs provide broad and general preparation. Additional training opportunities include

The Ph.D. and Psy.D. in Clinical Psychology degree programs are full-time, on-campus programs with residency requirements. The programs typically require four years of coursework and one year of internship; the Ph.D. dissertation may take longer. Students are eligible for an en-route master's degree upon completion of the first two years of either doctoral program.

Gain practical experience with on-site clinics providing expert care in addiction, behavioral modification, counseling for older adults, depression, family therapy, neuropsychological assessment, pain management, parenting skills, psychodynamic psychotherapy, stress management, trauma, and numerous other services.
