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Psychopharmacology Training for Practicing Psychologists

The Center for Psychological Studies (CPS) at Nova Southeastern University (NSU) in cooperation with the Florida Psychological Association (FPA) will provide practicing psychologists an opportunity to increase their knowledge in psychopharmacology.

A committee was formed that included the president of FPA. The other members included representatives of the Nova Southeastern University Community Mental Health Center, the faculty, and administrators of CPS.

The curriculum is based on the model developed by the Blue Ribbon Task Force created by APA. In 1995, the APA adopted and approved the task force's recommendations. This curriculum serves as a national model for training licensed psychologists as consulting or, if legislation is enacted, as prescribing psychologists.

Are you interested?

The program is structured so that a busy practitioner can participate. Courses will be held on one weekend a month (Friday, Saturday, and Sunday) for nine months over a two-year period. During the summers, students will spend 100 hours at Nova Southeastern University's clinic facility or another approved site.

Enrollment in classes will be limited.
