PROGRAM UPDATE

The Workshops in Operation Research and Productivity Improvement were quite successful. In all, over eighty students participated in the Workshops. They will be rescheduled on a regular basis during the summer months and at other times as needed. We will set a tentative schedule for 1984 and ask students to preregister for the workshop and date of their choice.

Our new degree programs and specializations in Microcomputer Applications in Management, Accounting, Security Management, and Telecommunications Management are being favorably received. The initial marketing of these programs will be the South Florida area and selected cluster sites. As is the case with our more established programs, we will deliver these new programs in field locations if we can serve twenty to twenty-five students in a cluster.

The Center for the Study of Administration has undergone a reorganization during the Summer. Dr. George Trivoli, Distinguished Professor of Finance has become the Academic Director of the DBA Program. Dr. James Klein remains the Academic Director of the DPA Program. Dr. Neuman F. Pollack, Director of the Master's Programs has become the Director of the Center for the Study of Administration. Both administrative and academic consolidation of the Center will provide us with the opportunity to contain operation costs and permit us to enhance program cross fertilization between our doctoral programs and between the doctoral and masters programs.

One of the first off-shoots of the consolidation this fall is the opportunity for MBA students to take an elective in International Business with doctoral students. Dr. Kooros will teach the course. Course requirements for the MBA students will be modified slightly as is the usual practice in other universities that permit masters degree candidates to take an elective at the doctoral level. We will monitor this course very carefully in order to ensure that all students receive the appropriate credit for their work. In the future, we have plans to run joint workshops open to all doctoral and masters candidates.

Our field-based program continues to grow steadily. The fall term will see new clusters start in Salt Lake City, Utah, (at American Express Company), Rock Springs and Gillette, Wyoming, and Gainesville, Florida. Cluster development is also underway in Phoenix, Arizona, Denver, Colorado, Bismarck, North Dakota, and Ventura, California. Our corporate program in Richland, Washington, has just received approval by the State of Washington to recruit statewide at both the masters and doctoral levels.

Our Coral Springs, Florida, program is expanding giving students in Northwest Broward County an alternative to driving to the main campus or our Boca Raton - Mitel Corporation cluster for classes. Much thanks goes to Pat Distasio and Kevin Keating for their efforts in Coral Springs.

- <u>FEE</u> A University registration fee is now being applied to each registration form processed. The fee is \$15.00 regardless of the number of courses listed on the registration form. Simply include the registration fee with your tuition and other applicable fees.
- TUITION The graduate tuition fee is \$375 per course. The tuition for program prerequisite courses is \$300. Students receiving employer tuition reimbursement are expected to pay tuition in advance, and then secure reimbursement from their employer. Promissory notes for partial payment will be issued only to those students who are waiting for student loans to be processed. Approval to sign a promissory note must be obtained from the Comptroller's Office.
- REFUNDS Refunds are made solely at the option of the University for conditions beyond the student's control. Refunds must be requested in writing, and the refund is based on the date of the written request form. When granted, the tuition credit will be as follows: After the first weekend 75%, after the second weekend 50%, and then 0%. The Add/Drop withdrawal form must be used.

MANAGEMENT CERTIFICATE COURSES

Nova University Master's Programs has several Certificate programs available to non-degree administration professionals already working in their field who wish to increase their organizational and personal effectiveness.
