AN OVERVIEW OF NOVA UNIVERSITY

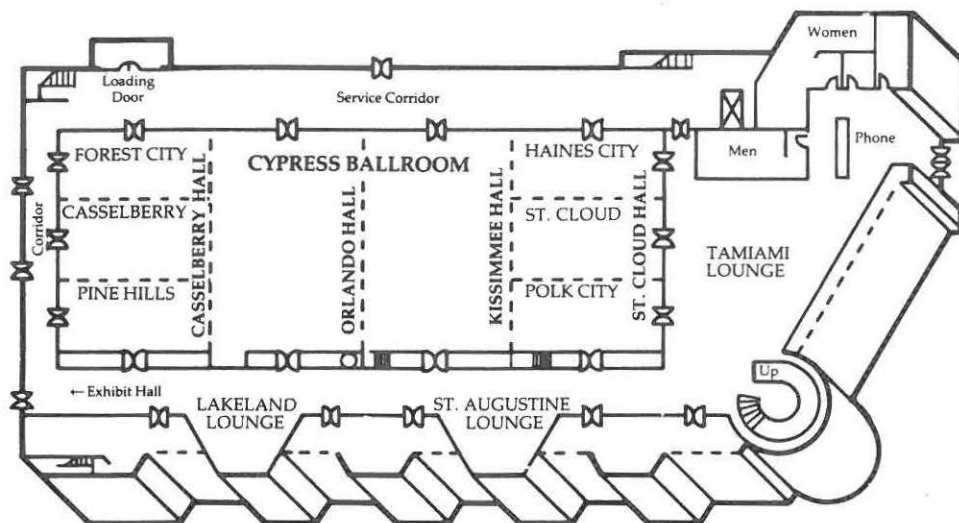

Now, let the institute begin!

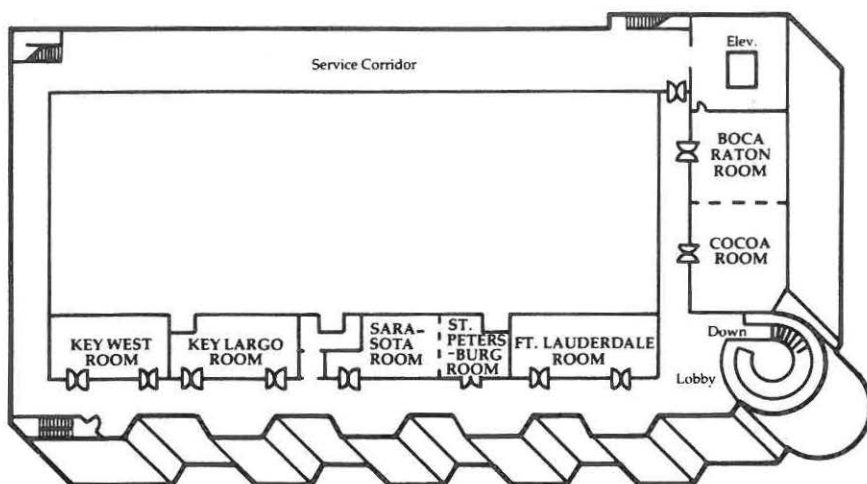

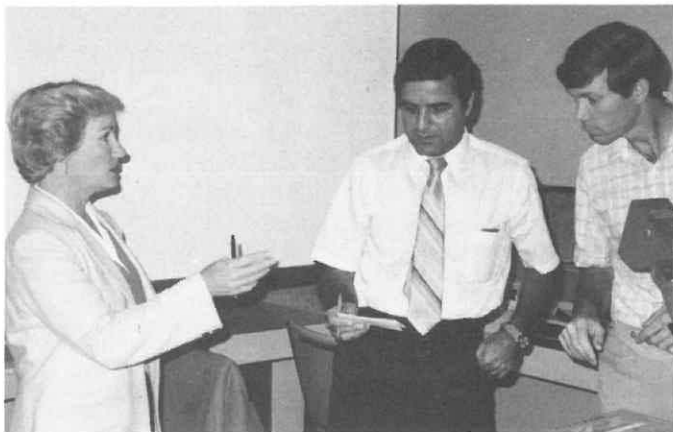
