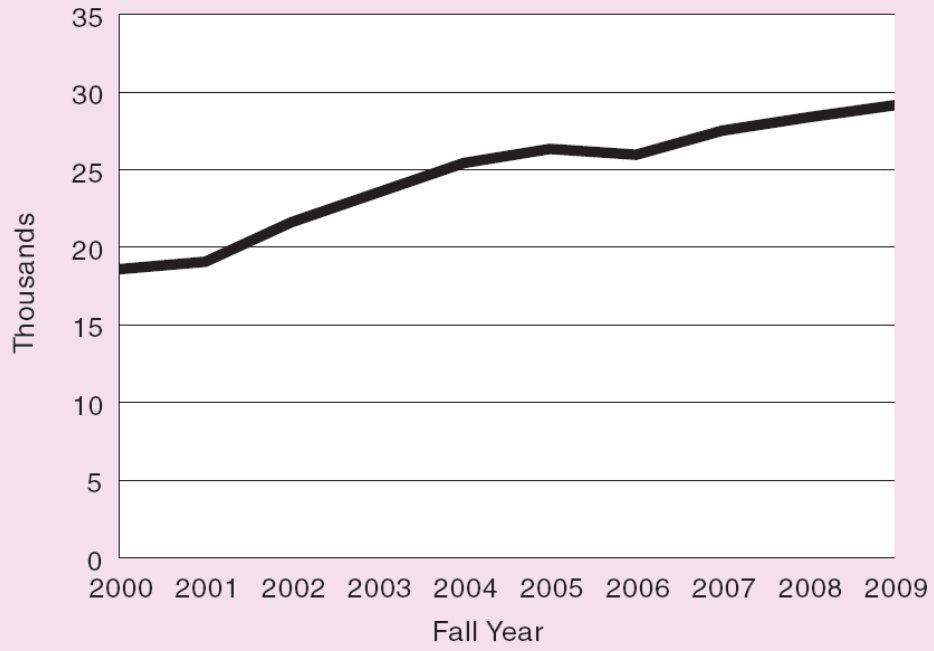

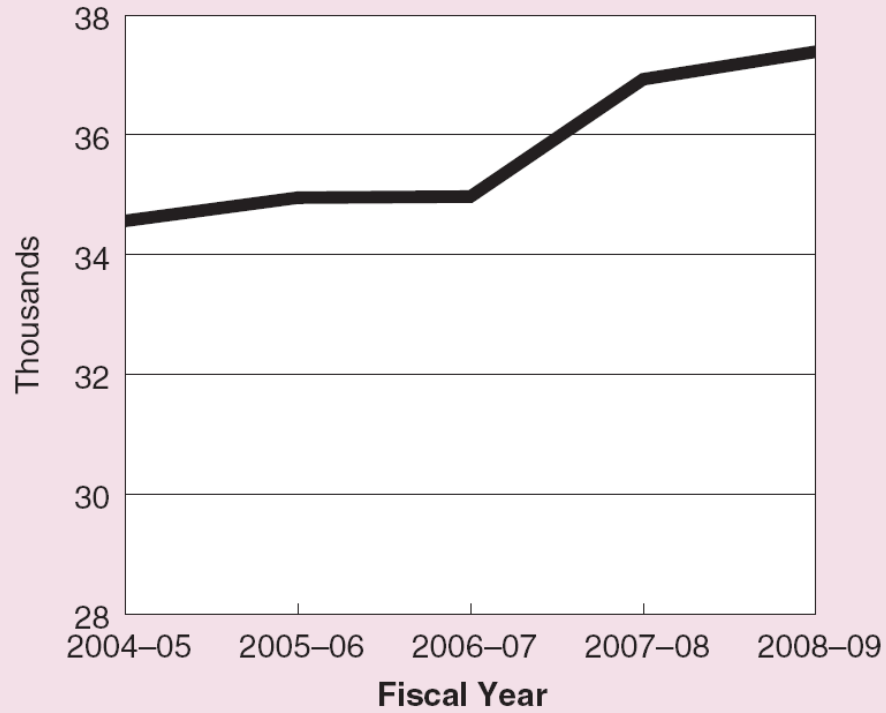

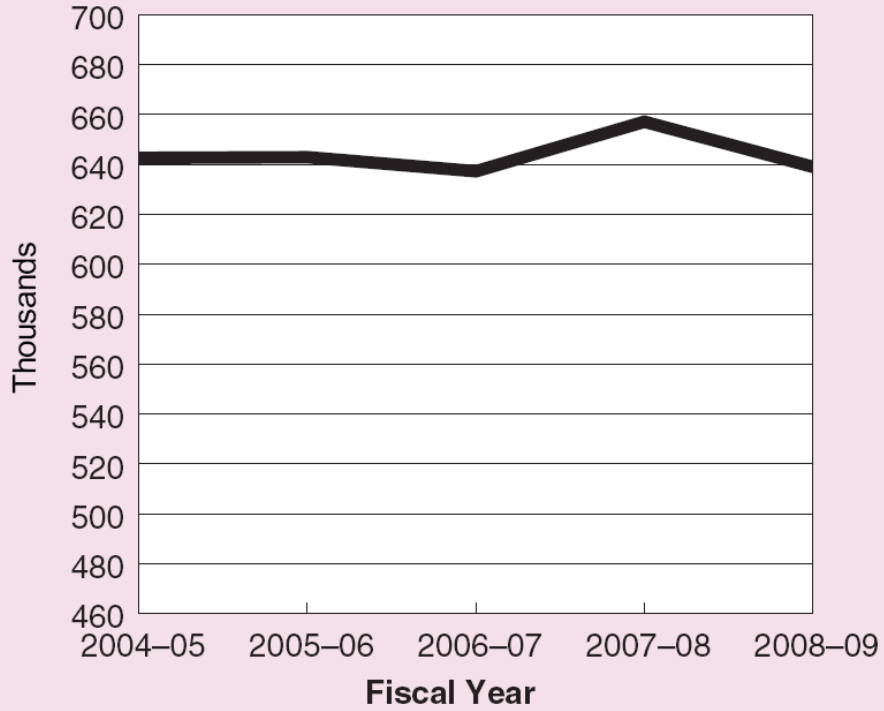
Cumulative Unduplicated Headcount For the Period July 1-June 30

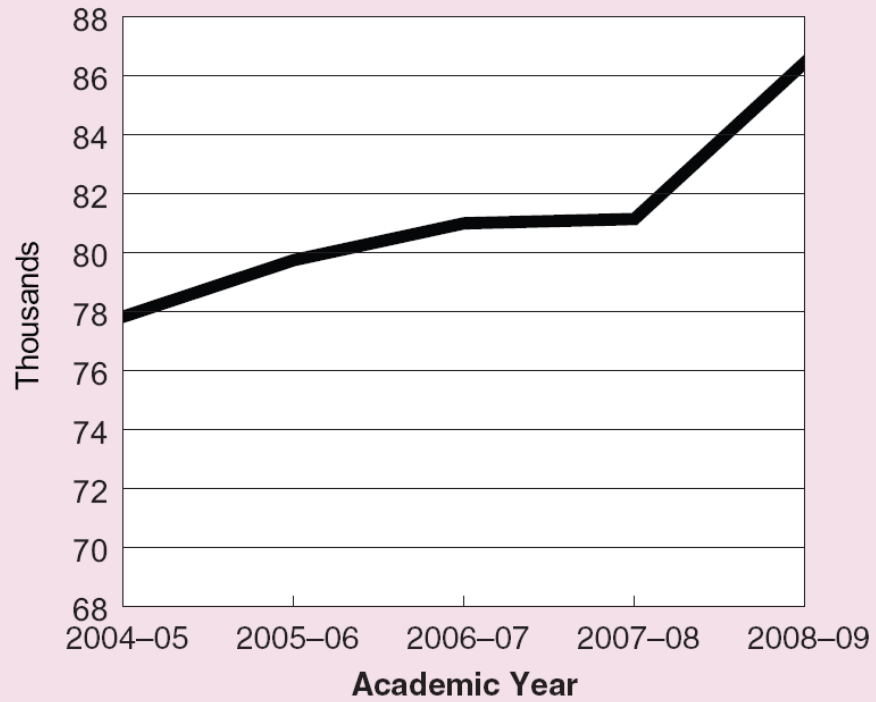
Cumulative Credit Hours For the Period July 1-June 30

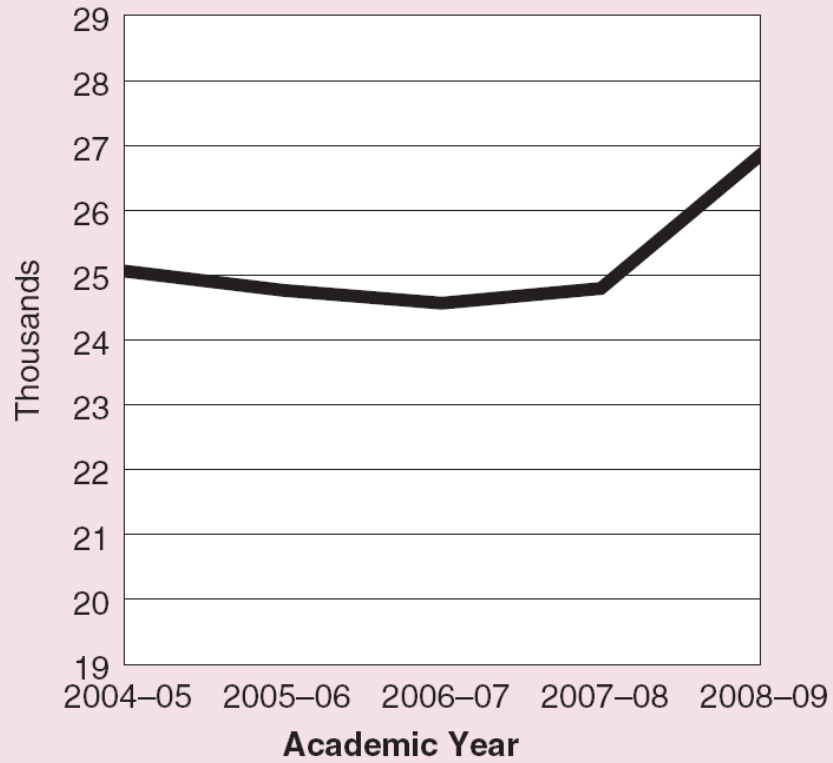

Cumulative Duplicated Headcount



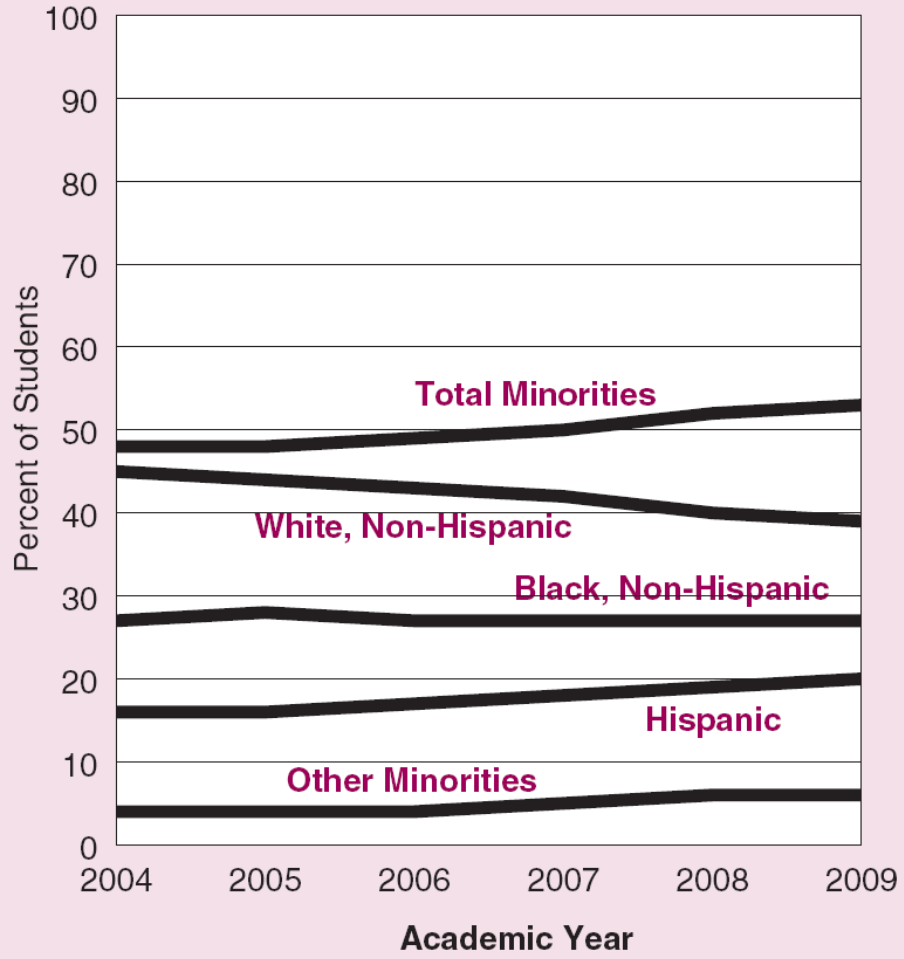

Annual Full-Time Equivalent Enrollment



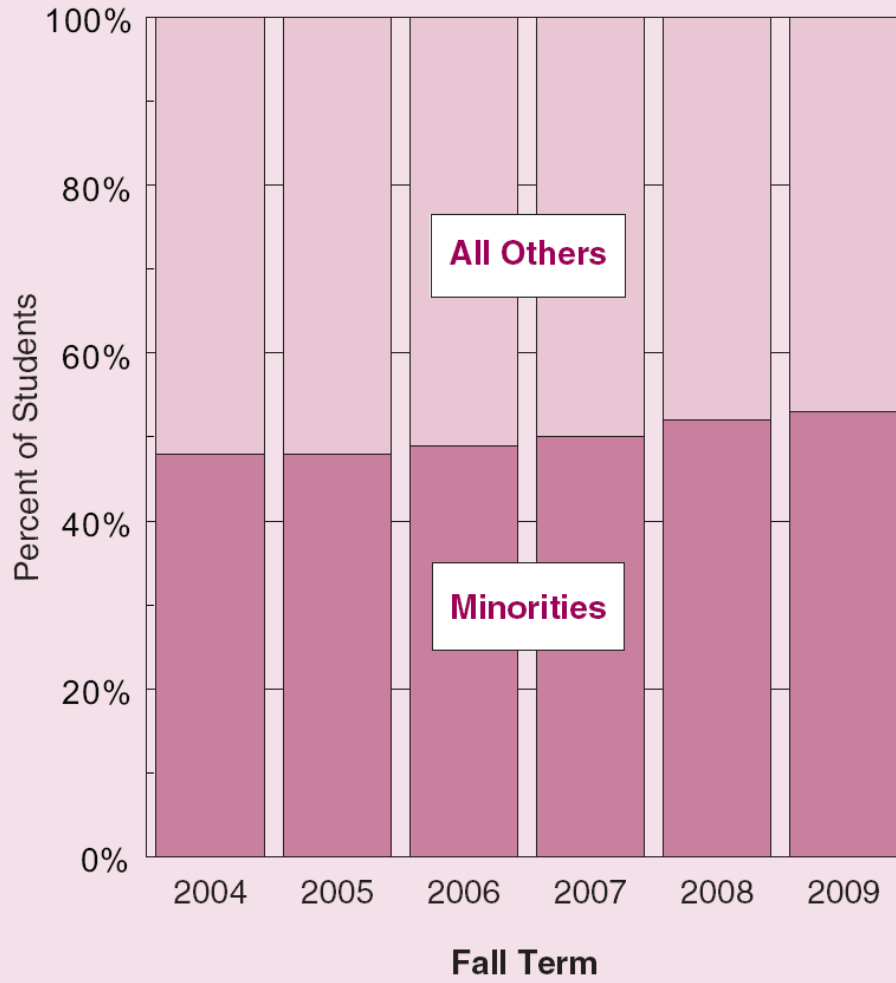

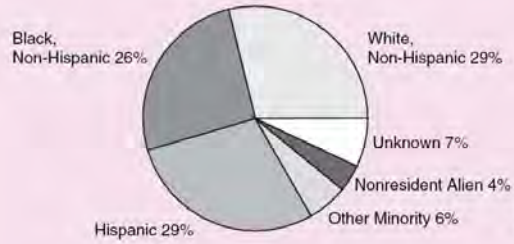
Trends in Enrollment of Minorities



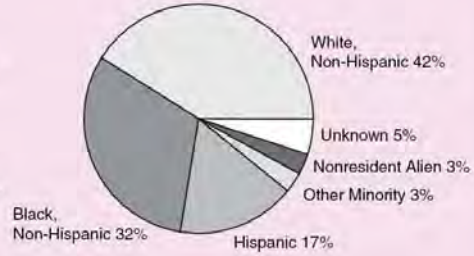

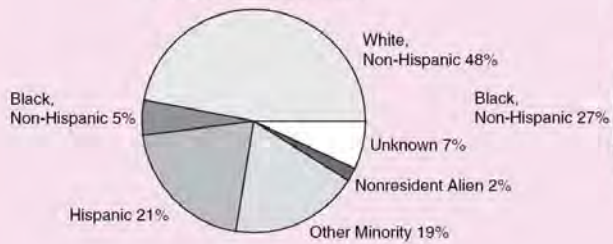

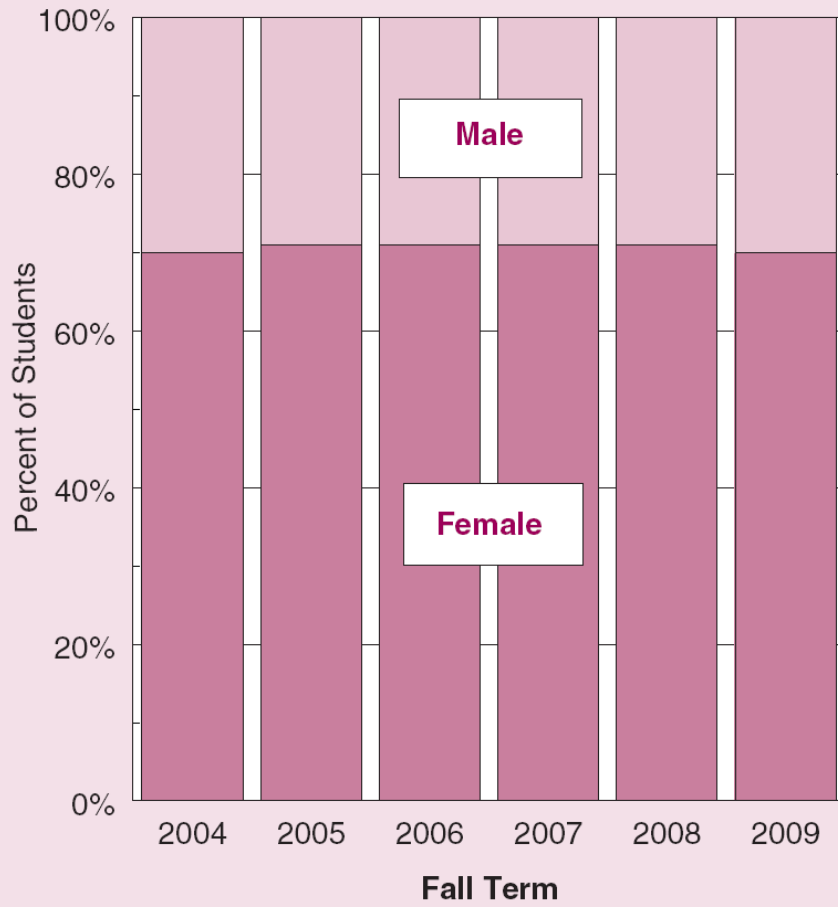

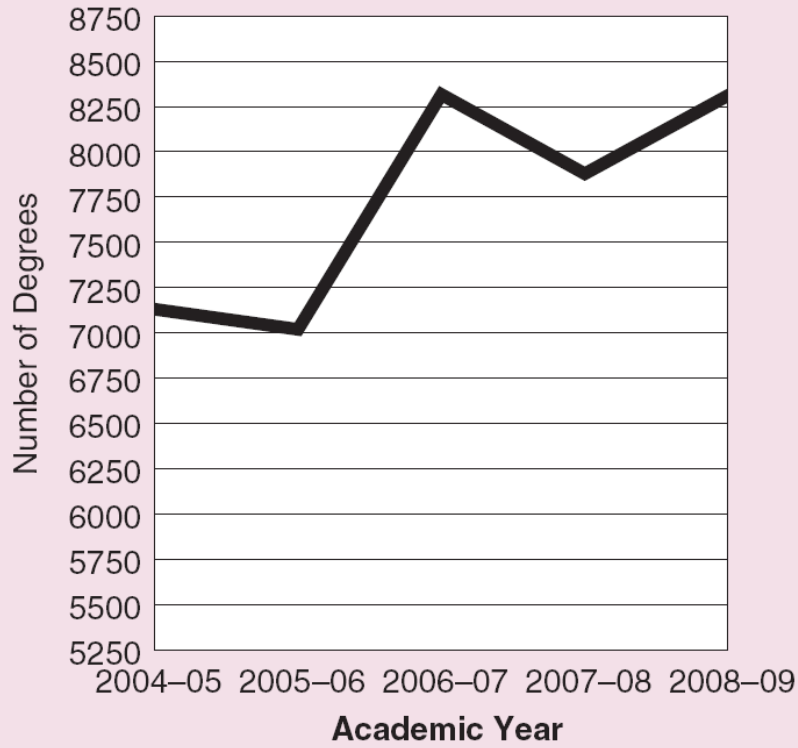
Trends in Enrollment by Gender

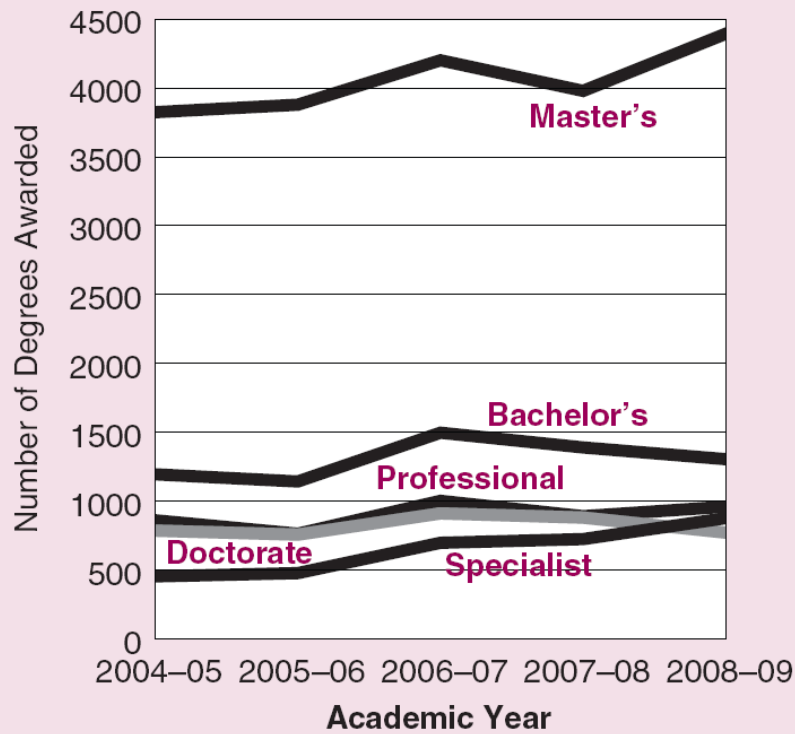

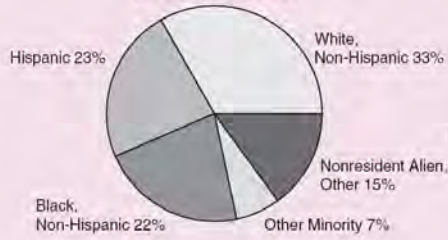

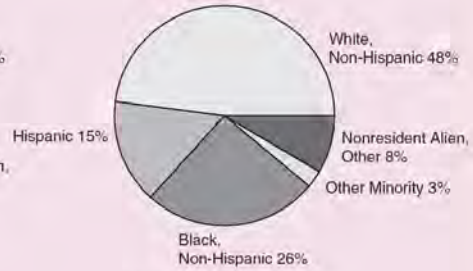

Racial/Ethnic Distribution of Degrees Awarded July 2008–June 2009

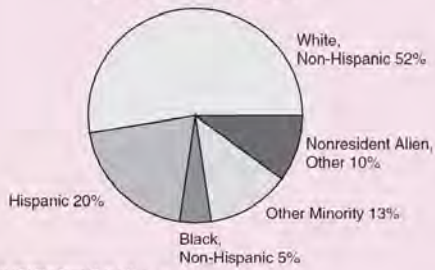

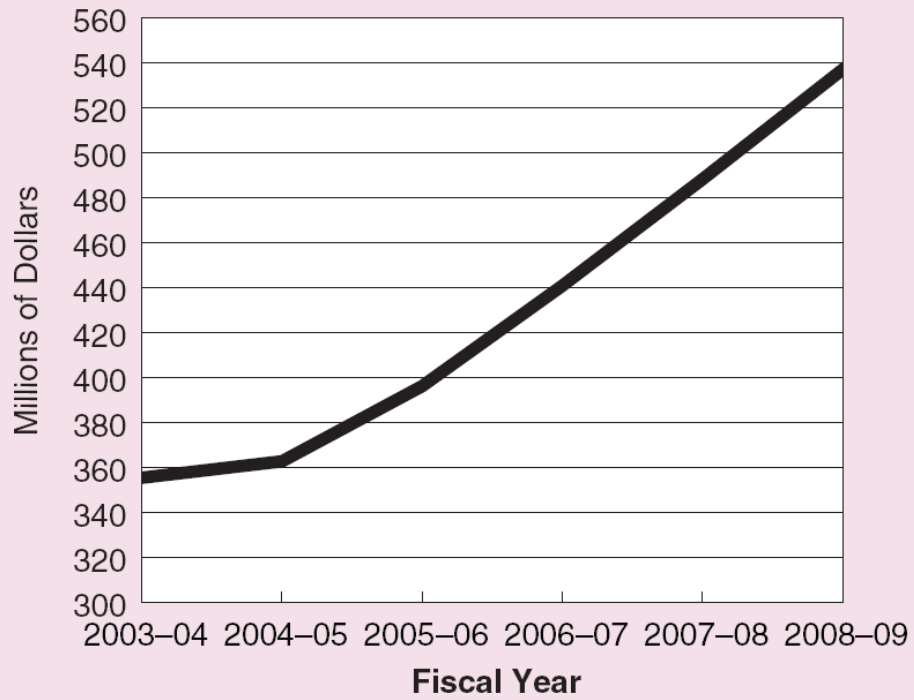

For the Period July 1–June 30

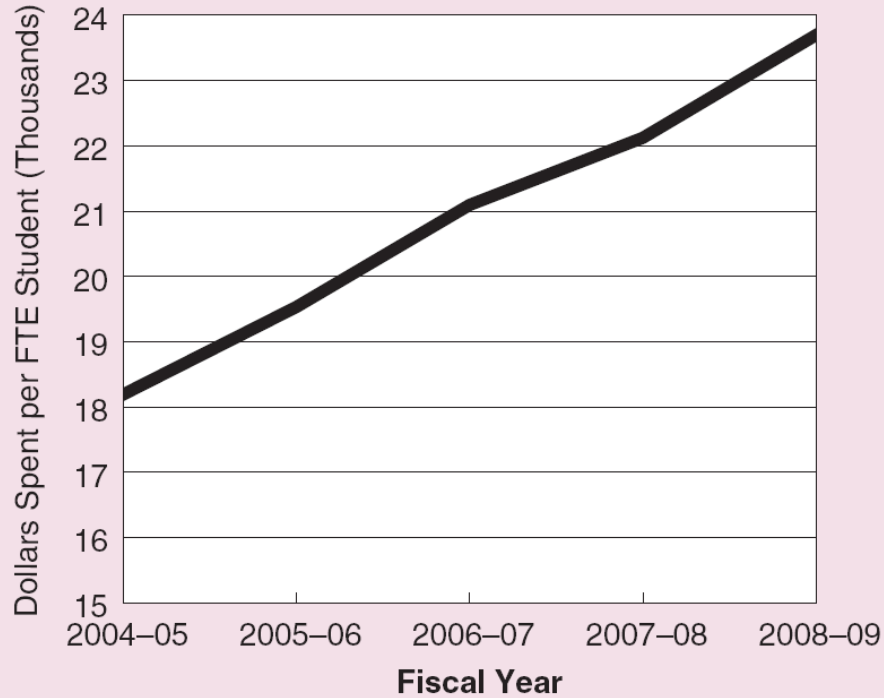

Expenditures Per FTE Student

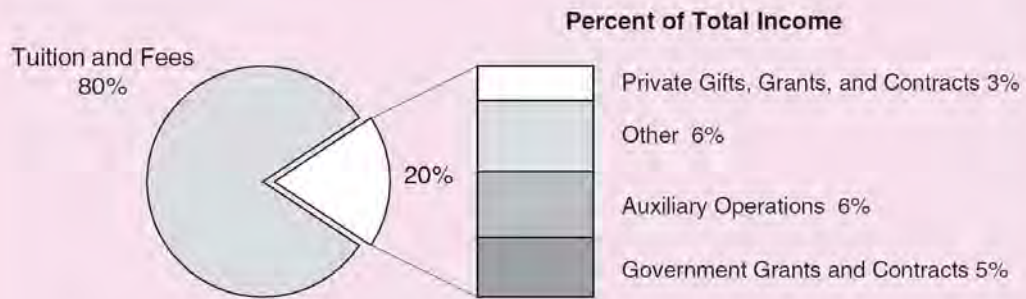

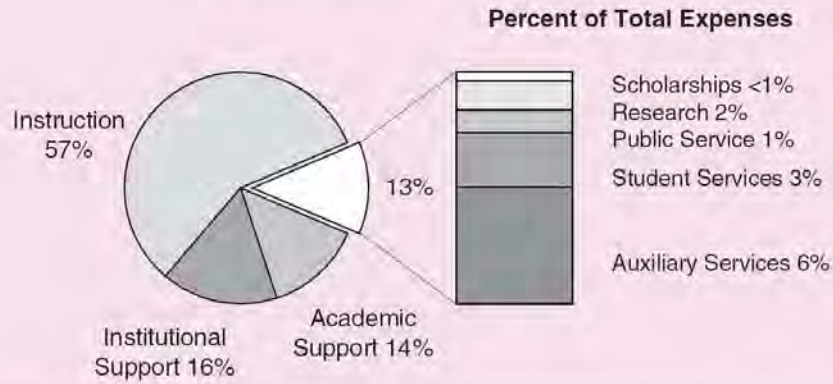
