Men's hoopsters head into busy month

Knights to play 8 of 9 games at home during December

Tony McAndrews' Nova Southeastern University men's basketball team (4-3 at the end of November) begins a busy month of December with a huge game against visiting Lynn University, ranked No. 2 in the NCAA Division II.

The Knights will spend virtually the entire month at home, what with eight home games taking place at the George Mayer Gymnasium (Broward Community College's Central Campus Building 10), including a key game against NCAA Division II Barry University on Saturday the 6th. Other home games include Florida Christian College (December 9, 7:30 p.m.), Judson College (December 16, 7:30 p.m.), Siena Heights (December 17, 7:30 p.m.), Catawba College (December 28, 3 p.m.), University of

Mary Hardin-Baylor (December 29, 7:30 p.m.) And McMaster University (December 31, 3 p.m.). Their lone road trek is Saturday, December 13th, when they head to Orlando to face NCAA Division I University of Central Florida at 7:30 p.m.

"It's good because the team's got final exams coming up, so we don't have to do any roadwork during them," McAndrews said. "It helps out a little bit. Plus, we'll be playing a lot of good teams, so it's better to be playing those at home than on the road. This is the part of the schedule where we could get a lot of confidence from it, we have a chance to get some big wins at home this month, which is big heading into conference play."

In other men's basketball news, junior Robert Robinson led the Knights at November's end with 16.3 points, 6.9 rebounds per game. He led the Knights in scoring in three of the team's seven games. Junior Sherard Hernandez was next in both categories with 14.7 points and 6.3 rebounds each, respectively.
