David Flynn made Honorary Member of NASFLHA



David joined the Navy prior to the US entering the war and served on the USS Houston, which was sunk by the Japanese. He was picked up by a Japanese vessel which was later sunk by Allied forces, and eventually ended up in a Japanese Prisoner of War camp, where he remained until the bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki ended the war.




