

## NEW LIBRARY AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY CENTER

March 30, 1999, is a signal day in the history of Nova Southeastern University. On this day a ceremony will be held for the groundbreaking of the new library and information technology center. This new facility will be the university's signature building.

Later this Spring a decision will be made by Broward County on whether or not it will participate in a joint-use facility with NSU. If it is decided that Broward County will become a partner with NSU in the construction of the new library information technology center, the amount of gross square footage of the structure will increase from 165.000 (three floors) to 275,000 (five Even if the County decides not to participate in the joint-use facility, NSU construct the hi tech library.

The amount of space designated for the collection will accommodate up to 500,000 volumes (without the County's participation) and 800,000 volumes (with the County's participation). Compact shelving will be installed in order to maximize the capacity for books and bound journals. Several electronic classrooms, a classroom of the future, and a knowledge navigation center will create the nerve center of the new facility. A large auditorium will seat up to 500 people. Several individual and group study rooms will enhance the learning process.

The building will be designed with the user foremost in mind. Students, faculty, and staff will find this new centerpiece of the attractive, engaging, campus and certainly user invitina. friendly. It will be a "smart" building, which will evolve and effective with remain futuristic. everchanging technology.

### WEBPAGES UPDATE

#### **HPD/ Andrew Copnick**

The HPD Library web site (http://www.nova.edu/cwis/hpdli brary/) continues to grow and offer the NSU community access to a wide range of health science-related WEB sources. **HPD** Webmasters. Andrew Copnick, and Todd Puccio. recently revised the Library's "General Information" pages, and all members of the NSU community are encouraged to

consult the pages for circulation and usage policies, hours of operation, and an overview of the Library's collection. "Government Resources" page received a facelift and contains an expanded listing of State, Federal, and International Web sites, including links to healthrelated statistical resources. The reference librarians are to pleased announce the availability of user guides for Ovid and MD Consult databases, detailing the systems' features and providing searching assistance. For periodic additions to the Library's web site, please select the "What's New" option for noteworthy announcements.

A most important Library web site feature is the Full Text Journals Electronic Index (http://www.nova.edu/cwis/ hpdlibrary/fulltext.html).Arranged alphabetically, the index contains links to over 150 peerreviewed health science journals that are available in full text format for the NSU community. The entries either provide a link Ovid **Technologies** to the subscription, MD Consult, or to a journal on a publisher's web site. Entries include a link to Novacat WebPac indicating the journal's full text availability. The index includes a weekly release to the New England Journal of Medicine Online and The Lancet, and full text journal collections from publishers such as the Oxford University Press, Wiley Interscience, Springer-Verlag, American Heart Association, and Swets & Zeitlinger.
