NEWS NOTES - It is estimated that in Broward County alone, approximately 100,000 people of all ages suffer from a hearing or related disorder. All facilities for testing the hearing impaired at the new Communication Disorders Clinic at the school are now being offered to children who are not currently enrolled in the school and to hearing impaired adults as well. There is a fee for this type of service.....THROUGH THE SUPPORT of the Center for the Advancement of Education, the clinic has also acquired additional experienced staff and faculty. Aside from the professional staff, they now have approximately 30 speech pathology graduate students who provide more "hands" to serve Oral School students and others.....THE RECENTLY concluded Fort Lauderdale Seminar Series offered lectures and demonstrations for the benefit of teachers, parents and others, and is periodically conducted by internationally recognized authorities in the education of hearing impaired children. Those who have led such seminars in recent years have come from Holland, England and Switzerland, and from other states in the U.S. as well.....
