LAW PRE-REGISTRATION - FALL 1979

Enclosed is a pre-registration form with a preprinted identification label for the Fall 1978 term. This form must be returned to the Office of the Registrar no later than August 3, 1979, either in person or by mail. You are requested to indicate any change of address from that indicated on the label. On the top line of the label is the month and year you are scheduled to complete your degree requirements. This is your priority number. Please correct if necessary.

Certain courses, noted with an asterisk (*), are priority core courses for second year students. In the event of over-subscription in any section, students will be reassigned at random. Students are guaranteed admission to the course but not necessarily to the section chosen.

Constitutional Law (LAW623) is mandatory for second year students. Second year students will be automatically assigned to a section by random selection. All three sections meet MWF 11:30. Changes of section are not authorized. Third year students will be enrolled on a space available basis to sections having the lowest enrollment.

Place an X in the box to the left of the course number for those courses for which you wish to enroll. Select only one course in a time block. You may not enroll for more than eighteen (18) hours. Students may not enroll for less than twelve (12) hours without written permission of the Dean.

Certain courses may have pre-requisites or have special priorities established by the professor.

Third year students expecting to graduate at the end of the Fall term and who have not successfully completed Legal Profession must enroll in same as an Independent Study with Professor Hyde.

Confirmation of pre-registration will be mailed to you as soon as possible. Resolution of close-outs is tentatively scheduled for Friday, September 7, 1979 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., at the new Law Center location, 3300 SW 9th Avenue, and during regular registration. Registration, including payment of tuition and fees, will be held at the new Law Center, Monday, September 10 thru Thursday, Sept. 13, from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Pre-registration is not required for Independent Research, Law Review or Moot Court. Course Approval will be required by the supervising professor for Independent Research prior to formal registration. Students should consult the supervising professor relative to grade and credit worthiness for both Law Review articles and Moot Court competition during the term and request that the professor forward grade and credit value to the Registrar at the end of the term.

The following rules are in effect and are furnished here for your information and guidance. Questions regarding these items should be addressed to the Law Center.

1. A student who has failed a required course must enroll for that course the next time it is offered, in accordance with existing rules, but, with permission of the professor, may be permitted to waive any of the requirements of the course other than the final examination.
2. There is an overall six-credit limit on independent research, law review articles, and moot court, with a cap of four credits on any one of these. There is a four (4) credit hour limit on non-Law courses that may be used toward degree requirements of eighty-seven (87) credit hours. These four hours must have the approval of the Scholastic Standing Committee.
3. One may do independent research only under full time faculty members. Students must have a GPA greater than 2.00.
4. The last day to drop a course will be Friday, September 21 and the last day to add a course will be Tuesday, September 25, 1979. After these dates, no student will be permitted to drop or add without the approval of the Scholastic Standing Committee. A notation of withdrawal will appear on the student's transcript.
