Nova Southeastern University is South Florida's multidisciplinary center devoted to providing educational programs of distinction from prekindergarten through the doctoral level. From its beginning in 1964, NSU has distinguished itself through innovation, offering traditional and nontraditional programs and promoting research into social and human problems of immediate and long-range concern.

The University includes academic centers in allied health, business and entrepreneurship, computer and information sciences, dental medicine, education, family education, law, medical sciences, oceanography, optometry, osteopathic medicine, pharmacy, psychology, social and systemic studies, and undergraduate studies.

The Main Campus is located on 232 acres in suburban Fort Lauderdale and features the Farquhar Center for Undergraduate Studies, Health Professions Division, Center for Psychological Studies, Shepard Broad Law Center, and University School. The East Campus, near downtown Fort Lauderdale, houses our School of Business and Entrepreneurship, School of Computer and Information Sciences, and the School of Social and Systemic Studies. The Oceanographic Center is located on 10 acres adjacent to Port Everglades. And the Fischler Center for the Advancement of Education is located at the North Miami Beach Campus. NSU also offers classes at the Coral Springs Campus, in locations across Florida, and in 21 states and several foreign countries.

Operating on an annual budget of approximately \$187 million, NSU is the largest private, independent institution of higher education in Florida, based on Fall Term enrollment, and has produced more than 50,000 alumni.

Broward County is also home to baseball spring training of the Baltimore Orioles, Dolphins' football training here at Nova Southeastern University, and more. In fact, the National Hockey League's Florida Panthers begin play this season just 10 minutes away at the National Car Rental Center, while Major League Soccer's Miami Fusion plays 15 minutes away at Lockhart Stadium.



Meet the Athletics' administrative staff...



COREY JOHNSON **Director of Athletics**

Now entering his fourth season with the Nova Southeastern University Department of Athletics, Corey Johnson has been a vital force on the South Florida sports scene. The Plantation resident has played key roles with the Broward Economic Development Council, the Orange Bowl Committee, and the South Florida Olympic Village, just to name a few. But it has been at Nova Southeastern University where Johnson has been doing the most good, leading the Knights' athletic program to consecutive Florida Sun Conference All-Sports Trophies in 1995-96 and 1996-97. He is also the driving force behind NSU's quest for a new fieldhouse, which is expected to host not just NSU's teams and offices, but also numerous local tournaments.

Johnson had been in South Florida before arriving at NSU in 1995, that being an associate athletic director at the University of Miami from 1983-87. There, he was responsible for NCAA compliance and eligibility, was special projects and tournament coordinator, and was responsible for coordinating the return of Division I basketball. His supervision included 12 non-revenue sports, student-athlete housing, scholarships and financial aid. He was also there to see the university capture national championships in football, baseball and women's golf. In 1987 he accepted a position with California State University Long Beach as Director of Athletics, Sports and Intramurals. And it was there that he proved his worth, handling a department comprised of 21 varsity and 16 club sports with more than 9,000 intramural participants (the campus had an enrollment of 34,000 students). That position led to his hiring as Director of Athletics at Colorado State University in 1991, where he was responsible for the overall operation of CSU's 16 varsity sports at a campus of 22,000 students.



PATRICK FEELY **Assistant Athletic Director/Business Manager**

Named Assistant Athletic Director just this past summer, Patrick Feely has been a member of the Knights' athletic department since 1995, when he came aboard as an intern. He quickly gained a position as Director of Operations, before moving on to Business Manager duties—a position he still holds while assuming the role as Corey Johnson's right-hand man.

Feely, 30, is responsible for the athletic department's budget, team travel arrangements and all business operations. He earned his bachelor's from Rochester Institute of Technology in Hospitality Management, and his master's from Kent State University in Sports Administration. Feely and his wife, Chris, reside in Plantation.



WOMEN'S SOCCER 1998...

1998 outlook...Rebecca Utter previews the season...

"The players that I brought in, I brought in to enhance and to pick up the performance of the returners. It's going to be very competitive this year for starting positions. Everything's open, with the exception of the goal. There's not a player that's on that list that can't start. And that's a nice dilemma to have, it's nice to have some depth this year."

Utter on the new Knights...

"Lauren Calkins will be a good strong outside midfielder, possibly a strong forward. She has a good left foot and right foot shot. She'll be consistent for us. Danielle DeGregorio, I saw her play up in North Carolina. She's 5-11, big girl, strong, everything in the air on corners is hers, so she'll be strong on the attack. She'll probably be looked at as being a stopper. Nice kid and a strong player.

"Dana Deis, a duel athlete (also plays softball), is a good player, consistent, she should be a good, strong outside back. Very athletic and a very smart player. Jamie Krause is a local girl, she's a strong forward and midfielder, and I can even hear her at sweeper. She can play anywhere on the field, so she's a strong utility player. And she's a smart player, too. She doesn't maybe have the speed that I would like, but she makes up for that with her general ability. Suzanne Mastrogiovanni is a 5-8 utility player that is strong and has a 40-yard throw-in. She's a big, tough, strong girl that's played down here for a lot of years before playing in New Jersey. When I look at her, I see a really strong freshman that's coming in. Missy Moore transferred in from Barry University. I wanted her last year but she chose Barry, so I'm very happy to get her in. She should be a strong sweeper. She's older, very mature, and she's going to be a team leader. Jessica Narvez is speed, speed and more speed. A brilliant right foot. We've got to work on her left, but she's got speed to burn. We'll put her on the top at forward and let her go. And Kim Starman is a forward out of Osceola High School that played forward and midfield, helping her team do well while scoring a lot of goals. She doesn't necessarily have a hard, power shot, but she places the ball beautifully."

The long list of returning Knights...

"Marissa Abbott's returning, and she's a strong player that was named to the All-Region Team last season. She'll be strong again this year. I'm hoping to move her into the midfield so she can have an attacking position. She's just a strong player, she's an animal. Mandi Adams is probably one of the hardest working players out there. She's worked very hard on her shot placement, and we'll have her in a forward position or as an attacking midfielder. I think she'll be the one that sets up a lot of goals this year. Olivia Bernal is one of three seniors and she is my utility player. She's played midfield for me for three years

now, and we'll look for her to be a big leader of the team this season. Elizabeth Conforti is one of my outside-midfielders who's a strong runner that has worked a lot on her ball-work over the summer, so she should come in stronger. If her ball-work catches up with her speed, she'll be unstoppable. Aimee Fernandez is another good outside-midfielder that I'm hoping will come back consistently strong. She's another one of my seniors that I'm looking to for leadership. Jessica Goody will probably play more as a forward this year.

She's got one of the most powerful shots anywhere in Florida. She just needs to get a bit more control of the ball and she'll be alright. Krista Harness is an outside right-back who, if she comes in shape, she's locked in that position. She's strong. If you look at her you'd think the wind will blow her over, but she's physically strong. She's persistent, she never gives up on anything,

and she's one of the toughest defenders I've seen. Helena Ioannou is also strong, she's worked out with me all summer. She's worked on her ball-work a lot, too, and will be counted on to be another utility player. Jennifer Jenkins is part of a good combination up on top that could be her and Mandi or her and Jessica Narvez. If we could play a 4-3-3, then I look at Jen playing on the outside scoring a lot of goals for us again this year. She's in much better shape this year, and is in better playing condition, so she should be strong. Cindy Ojeda is the last of my seniors, my outside left back. She's consistent, she's solid, she's one that knows that she doesn't have the speed but she makes up for it with her smarts. Heather Rogers I'd like to have at outside left-midfield and also a backup keeper. She's very important coming back this year, being our backup keeper to Wiggins, and she could even take Jen's position away from her. And when she's on the field, she changes the pace of our game. She's a bull that runs 90 miles per hour. Melissa Simmons is a strong midfielder that was also on the Southeast Region Team. I look at her to be consistently strong in the midfield, one that could control the midfield. And Jennifer

Wiggins, she should be back and better than ever. She didn't play a lot of last season due to injuries, but she's working real hard this summer getting in shape and getting stronger."

The forwards...

"The one thing about my forwards this year is that I've got them. Last year I had two solid forwards in Jennifer and Mandi, and this year I'm bringing in a few others that will let me play any combination of them. It may be a question of sending somebody in for 20 minutes, run the field, and send another combination in for another 20 minute interval. We could really throw the opposition's off this year with that. By the time they get used to two or three forwards, I can throw another combination at them. The keys, though, will be Jen Jenkins and Mandi Adams, that's an obvious combination. Also, Jessica Narvez and Kim Starman, although I'm not too sure about playing two freshmen together. We'll just see what works best.

"We weren't a strong-scoring team for much of last year, and that's because we were very deep with midfielders and defenders. This year, my goal was to get some forwards to give us more scoring opportunities. One of the things I think that did hurt us last year was I had to put Marissa Abbott back at sweeper, and she's a scoring machine. But now, by bringing in two or three strong defenders, I can push her up."

The midfield...

"The midfield is going to be a battle. There's a lot of girls vying for those positions. Now, if we play a 4-4-2, they'll stand a better chance of playing, but I'm not sure yet what we'll play. Either way, it's going to be very competitive. We've got Olivia, we've got Melissa, Marissa, Aimee Fernandez, Elizabeth, Suzanne, Helena...I've got a lot of talent there. The pre-season will decide who gets the early nods. I've already set up a fitness test where, if they don't pass it, they don't touch a ball, and that will be one deciding factor. Plus, the players are going to get ranked every week where they are, so they'll know where they stand with the rest of the team.

"This position is the most up-for-grabs position on the team. A lot of it's going to depend on what kind of a system we play. I may end up playing a 3-5-2 because I've got the midfield to do it. But having so many athletes that can start for us is a nice predicament to have. It's a new predicament for me and for this program to have, having so much depth where myself and assistant coach Cindy Marcial can sit back and see what we want to do.

"This should make our midfield strong. If we can control the midfield and if these girls really battle for these positions, it should make us much stronger there. But then again."

The defense...

"Obviously I'm looking at Cindy and Krista to handle the outside again, but I also have Lauren Calkins and Dana Deis, who's also a strong outside defender. I've got Jamie Krause and Missy Moore as sweepers, and Jamie can also play up at the midfield, which is good. And I've got Danielle DeGregorio and Helena Ioannou as stoppers, and they're both big, strong girls. It's going to be hard to get by them.

"We look strong all the way through. It's just keeping our focus on what our objective is game-by-game, that's what's going to decide it. Our defense, I will say, is pretty solid. I know pretty much who's going to be coming in to fill the positions and maybe work as backups. I'm also not too concerned right now about our midfield and what's going to happen there."

In goal...

"Jennifer Wiggins is a strong goalkeeper, but we haven't really seen it yet just because of the amount of injuries she had last year (broken finger, concussion). But when she was out, Heather Rogers stepped in and did a very good job in the goal for us. Should both of them go down, then we'll probably look at Helena as being our third-string keeper, she played a little bit in practices for me last year and also did well in a scrimmage."

The season's outlook...

"To be honest, I made an outlook for us last year, and I think we got too focused on the future. We're just going to take it game-by-game this year. We've got a good schedule this season with not just NAIA schools but also NCAA I and NCAA II schools, so it should be good. We got a little ahead of ourselves last year, so we're just going to keep the girls focused on it game-by-game.

"We have a lot of freshmen and a lot of sophomores, and having 14 players returning from last year's team is going to be a major factor in conference play because we have the most players returning in the conference, and, actually, in the area. And the freshmen coming in are all competitive, strong players, so I foresee this being a strong team, and the next two or three years for this team should be strong."

REBECCA UTTER Head Coach

Now entering her fourth season with Nova Southeastern University—and her third as head coach of the Knights—Rebecca Utter has gotten to see all of the highs and lows that come with the territory of intercollegiate athletics. But with Nova Southeastern University, most of it has been full of highs.

Utter, 31, has been a part of it all at NSU, and that includes capturing two Florida Sun Conference championships and two berths in the NAIA Southeast Region Championships in just three seasons of fielding a women's soccer program. Her first successful trip into the post-season came as an assistant with the Knights in 1995-96, when she helped the first-year Knights come away with the conference crown. Her second successful trip came last year—her second as head coach of the squad—when she led the team to a 5-2-1 FSC regular-season mark (second place) and a 3-2 win past St. Thomas University in the conference tournament championship game. Overall, Utter has compiled an 18-18-1 overall record at Nova Southeastern University—yet, in the same time, a 12-3-1 regular-season conference mark.

The New York native came to the Knights following a successful career as a high school coach in Broward County, FL. She began as an assistant soccer coach at Hollywood Hills High School from 1992-94, where she also coached girls junior varsity volleyball. She then assisted Cooper City High's program from 1994-96. Nowadays, Utter is also coaching the Under-17 Coral Springs Storm club team, and is also competing in triathlons around the area. She received her bachelor's degree in general studies with minors in chemistry and literature from State University College at Oneonta in 1990.

CINDY MARCIAL Assistant Coach


A coach that definitely helps add an offensive spark to the Knights, Cindy Marcial begins her second season with the squad.

That "spark" comes from being one of the top offensive machines to come out of Broward County, as well as college soccer. Marcial was one of the top scoring threats both in high school and college.

While attending Cooper City High School, she helped lead the Cowboys to four consecutive district championship game appearances while being one of the top scorers in Broward. Then, while at Lynn University in Boca Raton, FL, she helped her teams capture national championships in 1992, 1994 and 1995, and finish runner-up in the 1993 tournament. Marcial was a First Team All-American in 1994 and 1995, Second Team in 1993. She also captured All-Southern Region and National All-Tournament honors in 1995. Throughout her college career, not once did Marcial score less than 17 goals or record less than 10 assists in a season (her 1992 freshman statistics). In 1993 she tallied 17 goals and 15 assists (49 points), 23 goals and 16 assists (62 points) in 1994, and 29 goals and 22 assists (80 points) in 1995.

Marcial first coached at the college level in 1996 when she was a graduate assistant for Florida International University in Miami, FL. She also coached at the Boca Raton Resort and Club, the Pinetree Camp at Lynn University, St. Andrews Camp in Boca Raton, Umbro clinics and at Tequesta Trace Middle School. Marcial was also an Olympic Development coach, and guided the West Broward Lightning Under-16 team. She received her bachelor's degree from Lynn University in social studies in 1996.





Looking at the newcomers...

"We do have a lot coming back from last year's team, and I'm real excited about those kids that are coming back, but we're even more excited about the freshmen class that we've brought in and transfers that we brought in. We've got players like Ivan Tamez who was an All-America Honorable Mention and All-Region from Westmar University in Iowa coming into our program who's definitely going to step in right away and play. He's penciled in as a starter right now. Also, Mauricio Solano coming over from Taravella High. He's coming over with great expectations, such as there was on former Taravella standouts Jason Morris, Billy Ramos and Cristian Cubillas and all the other Taravella players that we've had in our history come over here. He's coming over with just as much expectation as they've given us and what he's done in high school, being an all-state player.

"Then we have Stan Cross coming in from Cardinal Gibbons, who's a Parade All-American nomination and First Team All-State and All-County, captain at a great Gibbons program. Then Phil Valenti's coming in from St. Thomas Aquinas High, he's just a born winner. He was there for four years and he went to four straight Final Fours and won three straight state titles, being a person who was greatly involved in those championships. So even though he's a freshman, he's going to come in here with that winning attitude that he's used to having in high school. Tim Combes is coming over from a great program, Gulf Breeze, and from the minute he got there, that program got much better. They're one of the top two teams in Class 5A last year, and he was also a St. Thomas player, being there when he was a freshman, so he's real familiar with our freshman coming in, and also with many of ours that are coming back, as he grew up playing against them and playing with them.

"Chael Soler is from the Christian Goffi-type mold, where he's a real good player who somehow slipped through the cracks. He took a year off from high school, went to Western High—just like Goffi—, was an All-State player, went to Broward Community College—like Goffi, played in a local men's league...sound familiar to us. He's going to be an enforcer for us. He's 6-2, 175, built like a man. Jimmy Johnson would probably want to look at him. But he comes over with a lot of experience and knowing quite a few of our players, so he's going to be a nice addition as well. Our last freshman will be Kevin Matherly. He didn't try out for us last year, but worked out with us this past spring who has a wicked left foot. We're expecting him to do some big things for us when he plays. Then there's Juan Camandona, who's transferring in from Lynn University. He was supposed to be here last year but couldn't do it, so he'll join us this year. He's a player we're really excited about as well. Our last newcomer is Randy DesRocher, who is a real hard working kid. What he may lack in skill he more than makes up for in work ethic. He was a member of a great dub team, so he has some good playing experience. He could really turn out to be something good.

"I look forward to all of these players that we have coming in. Some of them will have different roles than others, I'd say that, going into pre-season, Matherly, Cross, Solano and Soler have a better chance of playing right away than the others, and of those, Solano's probably the top freshman coming in that has the ability to come in and play right away. Cross has that attitude where he feels he belongs...and they all do. I don't want to say which ones are going to play more than the others, just because they're freshmen and they still all have to prove themselves. Ivan Alarcon-Tamez is the only one that I can honestly say is going to play right away, because he's a junior transfer that has experience. The other ones, they have the ability to play and I don't really want to go out and say that Solano is going to definitely play or so-and-so will and won't, because I've seen all of them play in the men's leagues and they all held their own. I don't like to single any certain people out, but there's a few that I think are going to add quite a bit of excitement to our program."

The returning Knights...

"We have a real good class of seniors that's been together for a while. Christian Goffi, Jason Morris, Billy Ramos, Mike Rivera, Jose Silva and Cliff Cameron all are back together.

"Cliff Cameron still doesn't get the respect he deserves, he's definitely one of our best players and is definitely one of the best players in the conference. He does a lot of the dirty work and sacrifices a lot for the team. He did it last year, and he's going to do it again. He's definitely a player that we rely on quite a bit. But if I had to pick out two players, I'd have to say



Christian Goffi and Jason Morris are our cement to our team, they're the ones who stabilize the team. Jason Morris, he doesn't say much until the game comes. He's not the rah rah type, and he's not going to tell you that you need to do this or this. He's not the Monday through Friday person that's going to get on you in practice. He just does his job and he leads through that. And then we have Christian Goffi, who's not afraid to tell anyone anything, including me sometimes, which is what we need. We need a player who's not afraid to speak his mind, and Goffi definitely does that, and he's someone that we rely on quite a bit. When Christian Goffi's on, we have a very good chance of winning.

"That everybody has been playing together for all these years will help a lot, because every single one of these guys is basically the same. They don't have that recognition of being great players coming out of high school, with the exception of Goffi. None of the other ones were really heavily recruited. Jason Morris was a little bit, but for the most part the rest of them were just good solid players who just somehow, for whatever the reason, missed out on something. To me, it's amazing that players like Goffi and Morris and Cameran are at this level, because they shouldn't be. But they are, and I'm grateful for that. But the fact that they've all been together, they've been in these big games, they've been through so many coaching changes—this is their first pre-season that they're going into knowing who the coach is and what to expect because they've been through a pre-season with him, so that adds a little bit of excitement to the program. There's some continuity, per se. But we're excited about the fact that these guys have been together for so long. They've played in these big games. The young guys will be able to feed off these guys and be able to ask them any questions. You know, the emptiness that these returners still feel over the Life University game, where we had it right there for us to win, and for whatever reason, we weren't able to. The kids know they belong with the best. So I think that the continuity that we have with those six players will definitely help us this season."

The forwards...

"Christian Goffi's name is obviously going to stand out, but there's a lot of particulars involved in Christian Goffi. And the main one—and Christian Goffi will attest to this as well—is that, without Luis Ruiz, there's not much to Christian Goffi. And this year we have Eduardo Ruiz coming in, too, a player from two years ago when Christian Goffi was even more successful stat-wise. With these two players, they're going to wear defense's down, they're workers, they can run for days and they don't mind doing it. They understand that Christian Goffi is our man and our leading scorer and the guy who we rely on, so they don't mind being the piano carrier rather than the piano player. They're willing to do that. So up front we're expecting a lot of good things. Having Christian Goffi coming back, I feel he should be our leading scorer in school history by the time the season's over, and we have Luis and Eduardo Ruiz here who don't mind doing the dirty work. For them getting 2 goals and 3 assists for the entire seasons means that Christian Goffi

got 22 goals and 10 assists, and they're happy that they're able to contribute to his goals and assists. They don't worry about being in the paper and they don't mind not being in the paper.

"Outside of those three, Kevin Matherly is one to look out for. Andrew Jennings also might be getting some time up front. But it's mostly going to be Goffi, Luis and Eduardo Ruiz, and Matherly."

In the midfield...

"There's where we still have a lot of juggling to do. That's where we have a lot of different options. You look at our freshman class, between Mauricio Solano, Tim Combes, Chael Soler and Phil Valenti, we've got four quality midfielders right there that we can throw into the mix. You've got Matt Webb, who was our starting left back last year and moving Dion Rodriguez over. Plus, we've got Cliff Cameron who's been in the midfield since the turn of the century, then Andy Jennings and Juan Camandona, too. Juan can come in and help is in the midfield, along with the four freshmen. So we look pretty good at that position, what with Cliff, Matt, Juan, Andy, Mauricio, Dion, Phil, Chael and Phil...any one of those can step into the midfield and help us right away. If I had to cement anybody right now, I'd say Cliff Cameron and Matt Webb are definitely cemented into the midfield."

The defense...

"In the back, you're talking about the pride and joy of Nova Southeastern. You're looking at Jason Morris, by far the best defender in the Florida Sun Conference. Then you look at Billy Ramos, who—along with Morris—have been here for three previous seasons. Billy's been a starter from the moment he got here, and Jason has been a starting sweeper since the day he got here. Then Richard Williams, who—if it wasn't for the great improvement of Matt Webb during last season—would


have probably been our most improved player, and one of our most consistent players. From the moment we put him back there, he was like a spark. He got better every game, so we're really excited about him, and he's excited, too. Ivan Tamez, as a newcomer, will bring some strong stability to us on the left side. He went to a few tournaments over the summer and had great tournaments, so we're really excited about him, too. He's a possession player, which is exactly what we needed, and he's going to allow Matt Webb a lot of freedom to go up and down that left side."

The keepers...

"In goal for what seems like the 12 year in a row will be Mike Rivera. Replacing him next year will probably be one of the toughest things we'll ever have to do here. We brag about Jason Morris, we brag about Cliff Cameran, we brag about Christian Goffi, but when it comes down to it, without Mike Rivera, all the trophies we've achieved over the years, we wouldn't have achieved them without Mike Rivera. This summer he had a great experience joining the Adidas Soccer League, playing among the top players in the country, where he gained some valuable experience. He's come back full of confidence, excited, looking forward to a career in soccer, and he's worked this summer like he's never worked before. And anyone that knows Mike Rivera knows that he's a hard worker."

Putting it all together...


"I think we're going to be good. I'm never going to say that we're going to be awesome or that we'll repeat as conference champions. I think we're going to be in the thick of things, we're going to be good, we're excited, the players are excited, the schedule we have is unbelievable that can go a lot of different directions. We can lose a lot of games, we can split some games, or we can win a lot of games. We'll really be tested, and the players are excited about that because they want to be tested. They don't want to go into games knowing that they're going to win, they want to go in knowing that if

we don't play at our level, we might lose. The players learned a lot last year, not taking every game the same way. We definitely got more excited for the Tamias and the Birmingham Southerns and Lynns and FITs than we did for some other games, where we should have been more excited and more fired up to play. Because of that, we didn't get some of the results that we needed to get. We lost two regular season games to St. Thomas when, for some reason, the kids didn't get fired up for those, and St. Thomas is one of the best teams that we faced all year. And it cost us in the long run, and the players realized that. Some results might have cost us some points which might have kept us out of the national tournament, where we could have gone as a wild card. We paid the price for it. We didn't take some games seriously last year. But that's one thing that the returners have added in all our conversations, which is they're saying that they can't afford to sit back and coast. We've got to win every single game and be serious every single game. So the attitude's changed where they're excited about playing every single game.

"Our season will be determined on not so much wins and losses, but where we are at the end of the year. If we're 10-10 going into the playoffs, that doesn't bother me. If we're 17-10 when it's all said and done, I'll be pretty excited because that means we're national champions and I don't care about the 10 losses. It's going to be tough, sure, and it doesn't get easy as the year goes on. But we're all looking forward to it. We're going to be good, we're going to be a nice team to watch, and we're going to be a hard-working team."

FRANKIE DELGADO Head Coach

It took only one season for Frankie Delgado to leave his mark on Nova Southeastern University. For that's just how long it took Delgado to take the Knights further than they had ever been before (without the benefit of an automatic bid, as happened in 1988 when Nova Southeastern University hosted the National Tournament). Delgado, after taking over the head coaching duties in August of last year—just a few weeks before the regular season was to begin—led the Knights to a 14-8-1 overall record, the Florida Sun Conference championship, the school's first-ever win in the NAIA Southeast

Region Championship Tournament (a 2-1 decision past St. Thomas in the semifinals), and just one goal shy of the National Tournament, as they fell to Life University, 1-0 (double-overtime), in the Southeast Region championship match. Before that, the furthest the Knights had ever gone on their own was the region semifinals.

Delgado has had numerous successes in the soccer world. The year before arriving at Nova Southeastern, he took Miami Sunset High to a 23-3-2 record, the district championship, and a No. 8 ranking in Florida's Class 6A poll. He also assisted at Anderson College, SC, in 1994-95, helping them to a 12-4-3 mark and a No. 18 NJCAA ranking, and assisted at Tusculum College, TN, helping them go 16-5-2.

A Miami resident, Delgado played his college soccer at Andrew College and Tennessee Wesleyan College. He was a two-year starter, one year captain and First Team All-South NJCAA at Andrews, and was a two-year starter and captain in Tennessee. He received his bachelor's in human services from Tennessee Wesleyan, while taking general studies at Andrew College.



RICH BARNARD Assistant Coach

One of the veterans of the entire Nova Southeastern University Department of Athletics, Rich Barnard enters his fourth season with the Knights' men's soccer team. Barnard, a 1991 graduate of the University of Florida (bachelor's degree in political science), has helped the Knights to two Florida Sun Conference championships and a 31-24-2 overall record. He is also the head boys' soccer coach at Fort Lauderdale High School, and is player/coach of a men's club team. A local resident his entire life, Barnard was also a prep standout, being an All-County goalkeeper and team Most Valuable Player for

Lutheran High in 1981-83, and was team Most Valuable Player, All-County and All-State in 1984-85, helping South Plantation High to the state title match. He also set a state record with nine consecutive shutouts and 13 in one season. Barnard attended Clemson University before transferring to Broward Community College, where he received his associate's degree in political science in 1988.




CRISTIAN CUBILLAS Assistant Coach

A one-season standout with the Knights' soccer team, Cristian Cubillas enters his first year coaching with the Nova Southeastern University program. Cubillas, in just 12 games played last year, had six goals—three of those game-winners—and five assists, good enough for 17 points, before he was felled with a season-ending ACL injury to his right knee. Still, his numbers were good enough to finish second on the Knights in scoring, as well as eighth in the Florida Sun Conference. Before attending Nova Southeastern last year, Cubillas attended the University of Central Florida for two years and

North Carolina State one year. He graduated from Taravella High in 1994 where he was selected Player of the Year by both the Miami Herald and Sun-Sentinel for finishing first in the county in scoring. He has played soccer for 15 years and hopes to follow in the footsteps of his father, Teofilo "Nene" Cubillas, who played in three World Cups (is the sixth leading scorer in World Cup history), as well as for professional teams in Peru, Portugal and Switzerland, before finishing his career with the Fort Lauderdale Strikers.



About the Florida Sun Conference...

The Florida Sun Conference (FSC) is one of the newest intercollegiate athletic conferences in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). The conference consists of nine colleges and universities and spans across the entire state of Florida.

The Florida Sun Conference is comprised of Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, Flagler College, Florida Memorial College, Northwood University, Nova Southeastern University, Palm Beach Atlantic College, St. Thomas University, Warner Southern College and Webber College.

The institutions in the conference believe in strong educational commitment combined with balanced athletic competition. In just seven years of existence, four different FSC institutions have received the Conference All Sports trophy signifying achievement in their overall athletic program--with Nova Southeastern University leading the way with three in a row, and four in the last five years.

Originally formed in March of 1990 as the Florida Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, the FSC was established as a conference for small independent colleges and universities within the NAIA. The conference name was changed in 1992 to its current name.

The league sponsors championships in the following men's sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer and tennis. The FSC also sponsors championships in the following women's sports: basketball, cross country, soccer, softball, tennis and volleyball.

In its six short years of existence, the FSC has quickly established post-season tradition with automatic NAIA Tournament bids to the conference champion in baseball, men's basketball, volleyball and soccer. Also, Florida Sun Conference teams are frequently found in the NAIA Top 25 National Polls in all sports. Individually speaking, athletes from the FSC have proven themselves worthy of national recognition year after year.

In addition to recognizing outstanding achievements on the playing fields in all 12 sports, the conference also recognizes achievement in the classroom. Each year an Academic All-Florida Sun Conference Team is selected. Last year, 102 athletes throughout the nine conference institutions received the award. The Athletic Directors of the nine member institutions serve as the Florida Sun Conference Board of Directors.

About the NAIA...

The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) is a completely autonomous association currently administering intercollegiate athletic programs to approximately 400 fully-accredited colleges and universities, more than 30 percent of all four-year collegiate athletic programs in the United States. The Association has member colleges in 47 of the 50 states and in British Columbia. The organization is responsibly governed by a 32-member Council of Presidents.

The Association administers 24 separate championships in 13 sports. Approximately 66,000 student-athletes participate annually in NAIA-sanctioned varsity athletic programs.


