"The people who own & run the book store, I find to be very rude & unhelpful everytime I go in there." "The Corner Book Exchange has the market 'cornered'. Their prices are outrageous, their attitude is poor, their hours are most convenient for them but not for the students. Perhaps a bookstore that can provide better customer service and a better selection

EMERGENCY MONEY

The faculty, staff, and administrators of Nova College have started the "Kay Labelle Student Assistance Fund". The fund will be used to provide student loans for school purposes in times of need. This includes money for phone bills and rent when the student is expecting money, but it hasn't arrived yet, or for things such as doctor bills or pharmacy prescriptions in times of emergency to cover costs. The loan is available to both Day and Career Division students.

Students can contact Dr. Dose, Dr. DeTurk, Dr. Alford, or Mr. David Millman to apply for these loans. The repayment schedule for this interest-free loan is based on the individual's financial status.

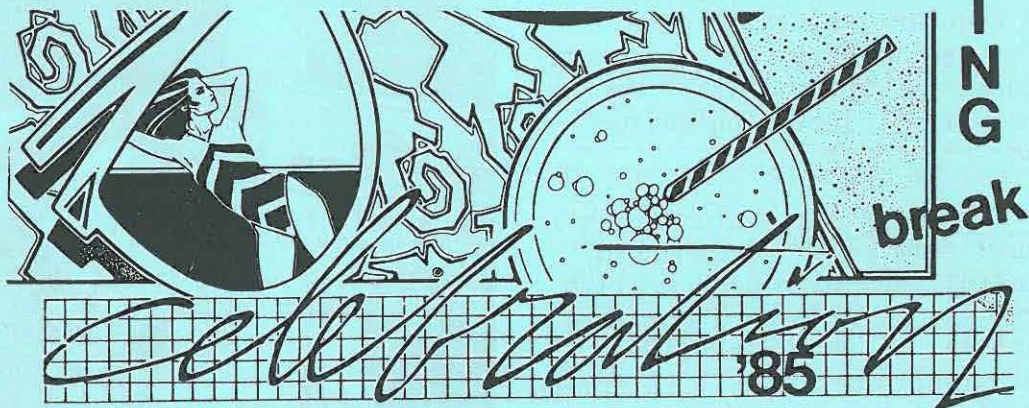

STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS AT NOVA COLLEGE

Nova College has several scholarships to assist students in meeting the costs of their education. The scholarship committee at Nova College is responsible for administering those scholarships whose qualifications include academic merit and/or financial need.

The scholarship application, recommendations and a personal interview aid the committee in deciding in which category or categories a student should be considered. All scholarships are competitive. The criteria on which the competition is based include the following:

- * full time enrollment at Nova College
- * academic excellence
- * strong letters of recommendation

To qualify a student must have:

- * a combined score of 1000 or above on the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) or a composite score of 22 or above on the American College Test (ACT). (Note: students who have not taken the SAT may take it at Nova. It is administered by the Student Affairs Office.)
- * a cumulative grade point average (G.P.A.) of 3.0 or better

The scholarships are awarded over the six-term academic year, and if the student maintains the requisite G.P.A., the scholarship can be renewed. The amount of the award currently varies from \$500 to \$1200 per academic year.

Students who think they will be qualified for scholarships in the "merit plus financial need" category need to fill out financial information forms available in the Financial Aid Office, along with the scholarship application form.

Scholarship applications and information are available in the Admissions Office, Parker 201. Deadline for applications is 15 April for the '85-86 academic year.
