The Broward County Women Lawyers' Association will sponsor a summer internship in cooperation with Legal Aid Service of Broward County, Inc. The internship offers a unique opportunity for a Nova Law student to gain "hands on" experience in the field of public interest law.

The recipient of the 1993 Broward County Women Lawyers' Association Debra Levy Neimark Public Interest Law Scholarship will spend nine weeks over the summer working with Legal Aid Service of Broward County, the provider of legal services to our indigent community.

The intern will work in a unit area of his/her choice: Housing, Elderly, Family, Consumer, or Public Benefits. The intern will be given the opportunity to conduct client intake, draft pleadings and write memoranda of law.

Each applicant must have completed her/his second year of study at Nova University Shepard Broad Law Center. Students with a special interest in and a demonstrated commitment to public interest law are strongly encouraged to apply. The recipient of the scholarship will be awarded the internship and a scholarship of \$1,500.00.

Applications are available from Mary Buxton, Director of our Career Services Office. Completed applications must be returned to her by March 26, 1993. Candidates should submit an original and two copies of the application form, a resume, a law school transcript, and optional letters of reference. Finalists will be interviewed by Anthony Karrat, the Executive Director of Legal Aid Service of Broward County. The recipient of the scholarship will be announced in mid-May, 1993.
