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

### NSU at Las Vegas

Nova Southeastern University is an independent, fully accredited, state-approved coeducational institution founded in 1964 as Nova University. The university is internationally known for innovation and quality in both traditional and distance education. ### The Vision for CCEA

A collaborative partnership with CCEA Community Foundation, the Clark County School District, and Nova Southeastern University has been formed to develop the CCEA Community Foundation Professional Development Institute. The institute will offer graduate level credits in a variety of study areas. The foundation will advertise, process administrative paperwork, and guide students in procedures outlined by NSU. NSU will provide resources toward administration of processing students and the foundation will provide on-site space for enrollment and processing students.

The foundation enthusiastically endorses our partnership with NSU and encourages all teachers to place their entire professional growth within the institute. The foundation will provide payroll deduction access to further encourage Clark County School District (CCSD) teachers to seek advanced degrees. Furthermore, our goal is to negotiate a specialist degree on the CCSD salary schedule and allocate more dollars toward advanced degrees.

The institute will become involved in recruiting National Board Certified teachers and will work to coordinate the collaborative efforts of NSU and CCSD to develop a postgraduate program toward that end.

The institute will provide a PDE (Professional Development Education) component that will have potential relevance for teachers who may later pursue advanced degrees seeking salary advancement or recertification. The foundation will work with NSU and CCSD to produce three PDE courses, offering booklets for spring, summer, and fall. The PDE offerings will concentrate in heavy areas of need, required TESOL, and innovative teaching techniques.

Creative planning for the graduate degrees available through the institute's coordination will enable teachers pursuing a degree in a particular specialization (such as urban education studies) to also attain the TESOL endorsement while completing the master's or specialist degree.

This is our vision for the CCEA Foundation Professional Development Institute. We hope that you will be a participant.



## 24 Years and Still Growing

Since 1978, Nova Southeastern University at Las Vegas has provided Graduate Teacher Education Programs (GTEP) for the working educator. The GTEP program currently has approximately 6,000 students in Nevada, Florida, and throughout the United States, all pursuing one of 38 specializations in a wide range of teacher education and teacher leadership fields.

The program focuses on four areas:

- growth in professional practice
- application of current research and theory to the students' professional work
- acquisition and enhancement of leadership capacities
- the achievement of individuals' career objectives

Courses are offered on Saturdays, after 5:00 p.m. on select weekdays, and in "mini" summer courses. This convenient schedule enables NSU at Las Vegas to meet the educational needs of teachers seeking additional areas of endorsement and offers those with a bachelor's degree in other fields an opportunity for a career change.

NSU at Las Vegas' programs are state approved, and NSU is a fully accredited institution (Southern Association of Colleges and Schools). This guarantees that completed course work will be accepted by the state and that it also meets professional educational licensing requirements.

## Admissions Requirements

### **Getting Started: Provisional Admittance**

Students who want to get started on studies right away may do so through the Graduate Teacher Education Program's Provisional Admittance, which requires a student to

- have an earned baccalaureate or graduate degree from a regionally accredited college or university
- submit a graduate admission application form and application fee
- provide a copy of the highest-degree college and/or university transcript

#### To Continue: Full Admission

- provide additional official transcripts from all colleges and/or universities attended
- if currently certified to teach, submit a copy of a valid professional or temporary teaching certificate

### **Transfer Credit**

Six graduate credits from a regionally accredited college or university in teacher education may be accepted in the Graduate Teacher Education Program. The credits must be less than five years old, with a grade of B or better. Some specializations require matching courses for transfer.


### **Financial Assistance**

Nova Southeastern University's Office of Student Financial Assistance administers comprehensive federal, state, institutional, and private financial aid programs. Degree-seeking students may be eligible for financial aid in the form of student loans and work-study programs.

Critical Teacher Shortage, Forgivable Loan Programs, and Reimbursement Programs may be available in some specializations.

Financial aid will only be disbursed when full admission status is granted. Students have 90 days to obtain full admission status once they are granted provisional admission.

Students must declare their intentions regarding the license/endorsement that they will be pursuing.

Special one- or three-semester hour courses in two convenient configurations are also available for teachers who need a reading course to qualify for a license, or to remove the provisional requirement from the license. Call (702) 733-3063 for more information.

### **Master's Degree and Licensure**


