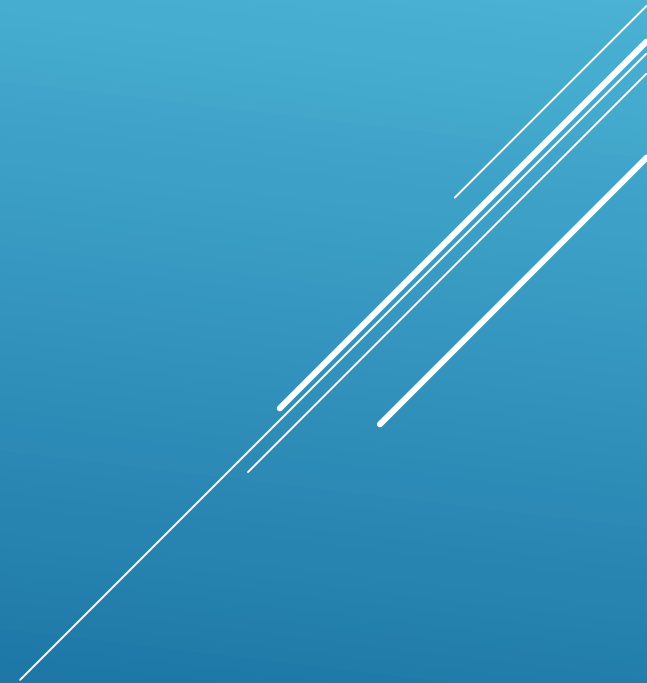

For me, the painting also relates to the idea of "The Teacher" in my own life. The painting is full of movement, with lines and shapes intersecting and overlapping in a seemingly random way.
