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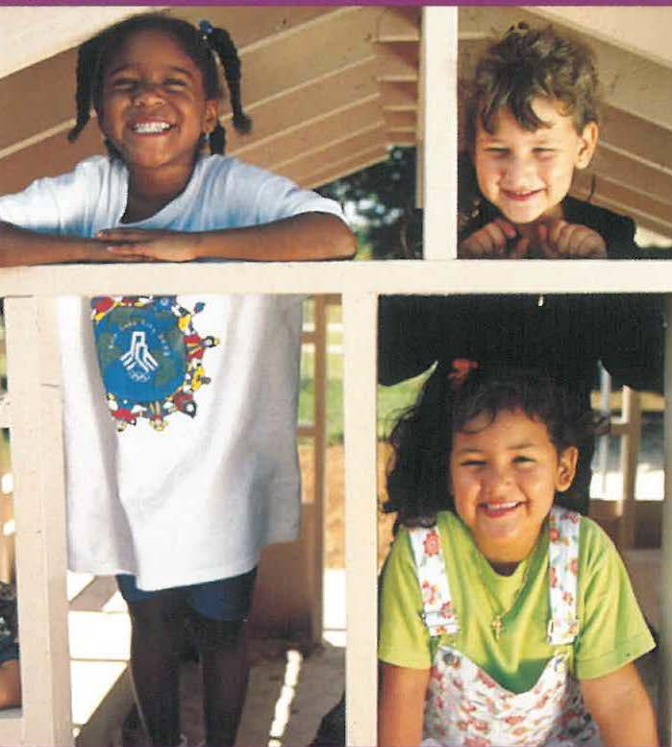

About the Program

The M.S./Ed.S. with specialization in **prekindergarten/primary education** is a 36-credit-hour program aimed at offering professional preparation for teachers working with children ages three through eight, or professionals working in areas related to childhood education (curriculum specialists, child advocates, education specialists, and consultants).

The program meets the requirements for professional teacher preparation in Florida. All courses are infused with the standards for professional preparation from the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) and the National Board for Teaching Standards (NBTS).
