

Welcome to Library 101.

In today's workshop, we will use NSU Libraries to enable our full text access to the New York Times. Start on the library home page: sherman.library.nova.edu.

Scroll down and click on the button "Databases by Name."

In the field that says "Start typing a database title" start typing 'New York Times'. 'New York' should bring it up.

The first result is for access to articles from 1851 to 2013. We want the second result: The New York Times (Online).

Once we click on the link, it will ask us to log in with our Shark ID and password.

This is the New York Times access page. Click the button that says "Create account".

Here, we have the option to type in our e-mail address and create a password. I like to opt out of receiving updates and offers from The Times, but you can make the decision for yourself. Then click "Create account".

Since I've already created an account, I see that my New York Times dot com pass is still active and that it will expire on April 9, 2021. Your access is good for a whole year. You will need to renew your access once a year.

Unfortunately, our subscription does not include access to the e-reader editions, premium crosswords, or the New York Times crosswords app. It does however give us full text access to the New York Times without a paywall or article limit.
